- 1. **Risk factors** something that increases *risk*; especially : something that makes a person more likely to get a particular disease or condition
- 2. **Body dissatisfaction** negative subjective evaluation of the weight and shape of one's own *body*
- 3. **Longitudinal research** used to study individuals at different stages in their lives. One group is studied over many years.
- 4. **Dissatisfaction** the state or attitude of not being satisfied; discontent; displeasure.
- 5. Adolescent (of a young person) in the process of developing from a child into an adult.
- 6. **Prospective -** expected or expecting to be something particular in the future. Likely to happen in the future.
- 7. Facilitate to make easier or less difficult; help forward (an action, a process, etc.):
- 8. **BMI (Body Mass Index) BMI** is a person's weight in kilograms (kg) divided by his or her height in meters squared. The National Institutes of Health (NIH) now defines normal weight, overweight, and obesity according to **BMI** rather than the traditional height/weight charts.
- 9. **SES** (Socio Economic Status) *socioeconomic status* (SES) An individual's or group's position within a hierarchical social structure. *Socioeconomic status* depends on a combination of variables, including occupation, education, income, wealth, and place of residence.
- 10. Multivariable having, involving or relying upon two or more variables
- 11. **Subcultural** a cultural group within a larger culture, often having beliefs or interests at variance with those of the larger culture.
- 12. **Epidemiological** the branch of medicine that deals with the incidence, distribution, and possible control of diseases and other factors relating to health.
